A Message from Bishop Scott Jones, Texas Annual Conference:

To the United Methodist people of the Texas Annual Conference, God still has work for us to do. The deliberations at General Conference yesterday were painful for many people. The General Conference voted by 438 to 384 to maintain our current teaching on the practice of homosexuality and our teaching on marriage. For many persons who were hopeful of a movement in a more

progressive direction, this was a devastating blow. The whole Church knows you're hurting and we want you to know we love you.

For people who were fearful that a change might be made they felt they could not live with, in a more conservative manner, well, their fears were relieved. And yet, it didn't go as far as they wanted. We love you too.

The General Conference did adopt the Traditional Plan. Parts of it were declared unconstitutional. This plan maintains our current teaching on these matters. Some measures to strengthen accountability for bishops and clergy were included and were constitutional. They also approved a disaffiliation, or gracious exit plan. However, it's not clear that it will be constitutional. In any case, all the things that were approved yesterday take effect January first of next year.

Friends, I know emotions have been running high. There have been things said on social media and to each other that, well, weakened our ties together. My hope is that we will stay together as a church and that we will now focus on our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We are, indeed, stronger together. I'm blessed to belong to a church where both conservatives and progressives are together.

I know that in many of our congregations in our Texas Annual Conference there are people who are on different sides of this issue and yet worship in the same pews and sometimes attend the same Sunday school classes. I think our diversity is a treasure.

I want you to know that I'm really focusing on the words of Ephesians 4 and I appeal to you now: I beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

We need to remember John Wesley's words in Catholic Spirit that, "Our disagreements do not prevent us from loving each other." Our unity in the Spirit is being tested. Now is a time to breathe deep, to avoid quick reactions and instead to thoughtfully ask, "How can God use us to serve Christ and God's purposes in the places where find ourselves.

Focusing on our mission and working together is the best way to move forward. May God bless The United Methodist Church and the Texas Annual Conference in the days to come.

I wanted to share an update with you from the Couch Family, missionaries that we support monthly here at FUMC Brenham:

Our Christmas and New Year has been a busy one but full of fun and joy. Just before Christmas as we pushed to get in one more hike with the students, the weather turned. In order to keep everyone safe our poor beloved land rover was left on the side of the mountain in a foot of snow. It was subsequently rescued and now has its own story tell just like the stories shared and created on the mountains.


Because secular Christmas is celebrated in Kosovo, we used the opportunity to have a party for the exchange students from the two years we've been here. It was another great time of connecting and we shared our reason for celebrating Christmas - God stepping down from heaven to show us true life. While we did have a small tree, lots of food, and even sang silent night (in Albanian) it wasn't quite your typical Christmas party.

The New Year has been full of hope for as we continue seeing students and those around us step up into building God's kingdom. Students from the last two exchange programs decided to help struggling families this holiday season in their city and surround villages. Far exceeding their expectations of helping 6 families with food, they were able to raise money for 46 providing clothing, blankets and food. Another group made up of volunteers/friends of Berat and Valdete's came together last year to help a family in need and now growing in their own initiative, have taken on a new family. The family recently lost their 13 year old son, have a house in terrible condition lacking windows and a solid floor, and have run out of firewood. As we are learning to live in a house heated by a wood stove, I can't imagine the thought of trying to survive weeks of below freezing temperatures with no heat. It was a joy to get to deliver the first load of wood to them and to see the plan put into motion to make their house livable again.

We thank you and your congregation for your support this past year and are excited to be joining you in seeing God's redemptive work and hope spreading in Kosovo in 2019!


