#### CODA

During my brief period teaching high school choir I asked my students to spend one day without listening to music. Not just consciously turning of the radio but to be conscious of the music they encounter in the background of their lives. I knew at the onset what the success rate would be and wasn't shocked to hear none of them successfully spent an entire day avoiding music. Music is everywhere we go. It's in the background of tv shows, movies, and news programs. They play music at restaurants, in department stores and elevators. Music permeates our lives every day and yet we too often treat it as background noise. Perhaps because that IS the space it occupies in our daily lives. So on Sunday morning it can be hard to truly focus on the music as more than just pretty background noise. How often do we sing the hymns without paying attention to the words? When we enter into worship we should strive to sing together not because it's beautiful but because there is meaning in what we sing. The United Methodist Hymnal begins with "Directions for Singing" from John Wesley. His last instruction is to, "above all sing spiritually. Have an eye to God in every word you sing."

# TEXAS ANNUAL CONFERENCE - 2018 REPORT TO FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH OF BRENHAM, TX

This is my report to the church on this year's annual conference that took place May 27-30, 2018 at The Woodlands UMC. This report had been delayed by waiting for further information to be published on the work of the Commission on the Way Forward (see below). Since this is my first annual conference, some items will come from my impressions of the process.

The bulk of the time was spent on normal, transactional business processes that you would expect for an annual meeting of an organization this large. Reports were given from the various offices of the conference. Budgets were approved. All of this was done under a strict set of guidelines.

I attended a general session for the laity. It centered on the overall conference theme of "We Love All God's Children – Read • Learn • Live". We learned ways of implementing this theme.

There were three celebration/services. One was for retiring pastors. Another was for pastors deceased over the last year. Our Pastor Sam Duree was honored and Beverly was there. The last was a commissioning/ordination service which included our Pastor TJ. This was the most inspirational of the three. There were over 1200 people in attendance with a small orchestra for music. The orchestra was completely overtaken by this very large group of people singing. I have never experienced this before and it was something to witness.

There were prayer and inspirational breaks during each day. There were also luncheons and dinners throughout the conference sponsored by different groups. I attended one luncheon discussion on the results from the Commission on the Way Forward.

There were several resolutions and recommendations to be voted on. These dealt with the work of the Commission on the Way Forward and the question of human sexuality within the church. The commission was fostered by the US Council of Bishops and generated a report presenting three options for dealing with the issue. This question will be explored in a special church-wide General Conference in early 2019.

There was a resolution to allow other resolutions concerning the work on the Commission on the Way Forward to be considered by the conference. This came about since the report from the commission came out past the deadline for resolutions to be submitted for the conference. The vote was slightly in favor but a 2/3 majority was required for passage so the resolution failed.

There was a resolution to allow greater tolerance in human sexuality. This resolution failed by an approximate 2:1 ratio.

There was a resolution to allow a "gracious exit" to churches that could not in good conscience live with the results of the special General Conference in 2019 dealing with human sexuality. This resolution failed by a slight majority opposed.

There was a resolution to provide "Heart & Mind Listening Sessions" after the conference so that more opinions could be heard regarding the work of the Commission on the Way Forward. This resolution passed by a wide margin and the sessions are currently in progress.

Bishop Jones has generated several documents showing his take on the general process, the report and the individual plans.

In our free time, we've been working on our new gathering space, meeting with the prime minister of Kosovo, hiking with previous exchange students, connecting with local politicians, and building bridges to outdoor communities. The next few months will be busy as our team presence will be at half capacity with the two other American families in the states for home assignment but the horizon is bright! We ask you to join us in prayer for the students in America, for the starting of discipleship groups, for Sarah and Hannah in school and for continued blessing within the fluid political and social structures of Kosovo.
