For the next couple of weeks we will be busy purchasing gifts for these children and adults, hoping to help make this Christmas special for them. If you haven't already gotten a name, please either call me or visit with Brenda in the church office. We will help you get the names, ages, and gift ideas for you.

There are several guidelines for these gifts:

- -- Brenham State School gifts must be dropped off in the church office <u>unwrapped</u> by December 6 (these gifts should be valued around \$25 each)
- -- Two gifts should be purchased for each Angel Tree child, each valued at about \$20; one gift of clothing and one for entertainment. These gifts should be wrapped and must be at the church by December 13.

Please let me know if you'd be willing to deliver some of these gifts this year. All families are in the Brenham area this year.

Methodist Children's Home Visit

On November 5, a small group from FUMC Brenham visited the Methodist Children's Home (MCH) in Waco. Although our Missions and Outreach budget sends supporting funds to the MCH each year, making a trip to the actual campuses in and near Waco helped open our eyes to what is happening there.

MCH presently serves 180 children who are neglected; delinquent-prone and need supervision; whose family cannot adequately care for them; with emotional or behavioral problems; who suffer from the trauma of rape, incest, abuse, death or abandonment; or whose parents suffer from health problems that prevent them from maintaining full responsibility for the child. Skilled social workers and other childcare staff attempt to build positive relationships with youth as they offer love, compassion and a supportive living environment.

The campus in northwest Waco is on 130 beautiful acres and has 16 individual houses where the children live. They attend school at the on-campus University Charter School. At the Boys Ranch, about 10 miles north of Waco, 50 youth live in six homes on about 500 acres of land. They learn to work with animals and learn woodworking and welding skills. At both campuses the children learn lifelong skills by assisting the food service staff with meal preparation in their homes. Staff members build healthy relationships with the youth to help them develop their strengths and talents.

The MCH offers a comprehensive program of care to meet the physical, emotional, academic and spiritual needs of youth. As we visited the various buildings on both campuses, we all agreed that the children who make it to the Waco MCH are definitely fortunate. We could really feel and see the commitment of those who work with the children and know they are making a difference in the lives of these children. --- Pat Clark, Missions and Outreach Chairman

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED

The exterior of the main church building (Sanctuary, education/CDC, and Sunday School/office) is in need of major repairs. The entire gutter/downspout system has deteriorated and needs to be removed and straightened/repaired where possible or replaced where necessary. While this is being done, any rotten wood (some of which is already evident) concealed by the gutters will be replaced. Some associated roof repairs to stop leaks will also be done. The Board of Trustees has spent the previous year and a half investigating how to best solve this problem conferring with multiple contractors. The cost to perform these repairs is a minimum of \$34,000 with the exact amount determined by the amount of hidden damage to be repaired.

Additionally, repairs to the limestone trim on the front of the sanctuary are required. Two large sections of the trim are cracked, loose, and in possible danger of falling. Estimated cost to repair this is an additional \$3,500.

There is not sufficient money in the special maintenance projects portion of the 2009 church budget to complete these repairs. Failure to make these repairs at this time will result in further deterioration and increased cost to correct. Therefore, donations are needed to complete these repairs. This situation presents an excellent opportunity for special year-end giving to First United Methodist Church.
