Instructions for scheduling your portraits:

Enter the following address into your computer's address bar: https://www.securedata-trans14.com/ap/firstunitedmethodistchurchbrenham/index.php?page=10

To schedule your portrait session, follow these three steps.

Step 1: **Select Number in Group.** Using the drop down to the left, select the number in your group (larger families may require more time).

Step 2: **Select Day.** A calendar will now display. Select the month and day for your photography session. (Our time is Tuesday-Friday, January 7-10 (2:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m.) and Saturday, January 11 (10:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.)

Step 3: **Select Time.** A list of available times will be displayed. Click the center of the white box next to the desired time. You will then be prompted to register for your portrait session. Greyed boxes are already reserved.

After the caroling we will share in a meal and Pastor Jon will share a special message with us. Then we will have a special time for crafts and treats for kids of all ages.



A Fast of the Heart, Mind, and Mouth During Advent

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

While some of our friends were at The Gathering in September, we heard Dr. Frank Thomas, Jr. ask all of us, "Has anyone inquired of the Lord? Has anyone called for a fast? Who has called a prayer meeting?" This message resonated deeply with the gathered body that evening and continues to guide us as Chairs of our Orders and Fellowship of Local Pastors. We believe that we are at a time in the life of the Church and our Annual Conference like no other we have experienced! We need each other to live faithfully in this time. To that end, please consider this invitation to keep a Fast of the Heart, Mind, and Mouth during the season of Advent.

THE FAST:

In all our thoughts and speech, fast from all that is destructive, derogatory, and mean-spirited within our covenant relationships as leaders in the church. As Paul wrote to the church at Ephesus (4:29 THE MESSAGE):

"Watch the way you talk. Let nothing foul or dirty come out of your mouth. Say only what helps, each word a gift."

THE FEAST:

In all our thoughts and speech, feast on all that is a gift of grace, speaking the truth in love, allowing God to live and move through all we think and say within our covenant relationships as leaders in the church. As the Psalmist wrote (19:14 NRSV):

"Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you, O LORD,my Rock and my Redeemer."

PRAYING FOR AND WITH ONE ANOTHER:

Please pray for fifteen minutes at one or more of these times each day: 6:00 am, 12:00 noon, 6:00 pm, 12:00 midnight. As we pray at these times, please focus your prayers for the strengthening and restoring of our covenant relationships across the Annual Conference, including our Bishop, Cabinet, Conference and District Staff, those in your district, all across the Conference, those with whom you may have shared difficulties in relationships, and all who seek to live faithfully fulfilling God's call upon our lives.

As Jesus instructed the people in the Sermon on the Mount, (Matthew 6:6 NRSV):

"But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you."

As we live through all that is life and ministry this Advent, when we seemingly have no time for even one thing more, consider this invitation that as we celebrate the coming of the Christ Child and anticipate Christ's return in victory, we should endeavor together that our relationships with each other, as leaders in the church, be such that the Love of Jesus Christ shines through for all to see, and we indeed bear witness to the Love of God in this world.
