A Vision of the Cross

"May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." Galatians 6:14

"But the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." 1 Corinthians 1:18

When I was about 9 or 10 years old I vividly remember a statue hanging on a hospital wall. It scared me. It was a statue of a person with big nails stuck in his hands and feet. He had something resting on his head and he was bleeding from his hands, feet, and head. He was hurting. I wanted to know who this man was. I wanted to know why he was hurting. I wanted to know why he was nailed to two boards which were hanging on the wall.

While we have tried, we and countless Christians have never escaped the shock of the statement, "He was crucified!" On a Roman cross, an instrument of execution reserved for murderers and traitors, Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, was put to death, thorns jammed down on his head, hands and feet nailed to the wood, hanging there suspended between heaven and earth.

Crucifixion was a terrible way to die. Victims suffered great pain and humiliation as they hung before jeering crowds. A Roman writer called crucifixion "that most cruel and terrifying punishment." A Roman citizen could not be crucified in this way. It was too horrible.

But Jesus Christ, who, though He was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant being born in human likeness...He humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. Philippians 2:5-8

Think of it! For over 2000 years people all over the world place the same sign in the center of their worship space. What a mark it has left upon the world! What a place it holds in the Christian heart and mind! We may not know all of the theological details of Christianity, but we know that Jesus Christ was crucified. We would have long since forgotten this event were it not for the cross. The cross means that He died for us. The cross means that He died for me.

Christ was crucified on our behalf that we might be awakened to God's love – to forgiveness – to eternal life. Whatever we read or hear about God, the cross remains the center of our theology and our belief. The bottom line is this – "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

That battered and bleeding man hanging before me that day was Jesus the Christ. He was killed by sinful men that we might know the love, mercy, and salvation of the living God. Jesus died for me. Jesus died for us. Our suffering is bound up in His suffering. Our pains become His pain. And His love covers all. See you Sunday, Kay


LENTEN MISSION PROJECT Bead for Life


