What's Right with the Church!

(I write this article after overhearing a conversation at a restaurant in College Station. I also write this because I love the church.)

There's so much that's right with the church. I think it's important for all of us to be reminded of that from time to time. I think it's important because there are so many people today within the church or outside the church, or on the sideline of the church, who are constantly reminding us of all that's wrong with the church. They may not say it directly. Sometimes they say it indirectly, at lunch or during coffee break, and they start talking about why they're not in the church or about their criticisms of the church. And they point out to us all that's wrong with the church.

Sometimes they say we're hypocrites. I'm sure you've heard it before, "You folks in the church are nothing but a bunch of hypocrites." How do you respond to an accusation like that? Well, one way of responding is by agreeing...because they're right. First United Methodist in New Orleans ran an ad in the newspaper that said, "Tired of worshipping with the same old bunch of hypocrites? Well, come and worship with a new bunch of hypocrites!" I don't know whether I like that ad, but I appreciate the honesty. That's who we are.

But, it's not all that we are. There is a lot that's wrong with the church today and it's awfully easy to sit back and criticize the church. But in my humble opinion, even though there's a lot wrong with the church, there's even more that's right with the church.

There is no institution in the world that serves people like the church. There is no institution in the world that helps families like the church. There is no institution in the world that teaches love like the church. There is no institution in the world that lifts God up like the church. There is no institution in the world that proclaims that we are forgiven like the church. There is no other institution that offers the wonderful good news of grace. And there is no other institution that has as its foundation the sacrificial love of Jesus Christ.

There is a lot that's wrong with the church. And it's so easy to sit back and criticize the church, isn't it? But there's even more that's right with the church. Let's not forget it. And let's not let the world forget it either.

Share a special recipe with a friend


Sometime drop everything to help someone else
