





#### July 2<sup>nd</sup>...4<sup>th</sup>...or 5<sup>th</sup>... Let's Celebrate Anyway!

Almost every Independence Day, revisionist historians are wont to point out that the Continental Congress technically did not declare independence on July 4<sup>th</sup>. These debunkers routinely remind us that the declaration actually was made on July 2, 1776.

No doubt, these are the same folks who insist that Abner Doubleday didn't invent baseball, that Ben Franklin never flew his kite in a thunderstorm and that Buffalo Bill was a sorry shot. It's difficult to understand why some people prefer such revisionism to the nobler vision of an earlier time.

The tendency for history to alter itself always amuses me. When the original story does not carry quite the punch it should, somebody colors it up a little and passes it on. When more than a few repeat this, it's not long before this original version is completely lost. So it is with the story of American independence.

For instance, as I said earlier, Independence Day should actually be the  $2^{nd}$  of July, not the  $4^{th}$ . True, the Declaration of Independence was dated July  $4^{th}$ , 1776. But independence itself had been declared two days earlier. On the Fourth of July, all that happened was the approval of the final draft of the document, in a vote that was not even unanimous...even though the document's opening statement claims that everybody agreed. In fact, New York did not like the declaration and balked on signing it until July  $19^{th}$ . And most of those brave men actually signed their "John Henrys" (or "John Hancock's") on August  $2^{nd}$ . Some waited weeks longer, and the final guy held out five more years, not signing until 1781.

On July 3, 1776, John Adams wrote to his wife Abigail predicting: "The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable date in the history of America!" Many years later, an editor secretly altered the date of Adams' letter, from July 3 to July 5, and subtly changed Adams' message to his wife to: "The fourth day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable date in the history of America!"

And how about the Liberty Bell? All through the American Revolution, nobody cared about it. The story about how it rang in American independence is fanciful. True, it did hang in the Philadelphia statehouse when the Declaration was drafted. But no one thought of ringing it. Fifty years later, the city of Philadelphia tried to sell the old, cracked bell for scrap metal, but could not find a buyer! Not until 1847, when journalist George Lippard made up a fanciful story in his <u>Legends of the American Revolution</u>, did it gain fame.

Stories! How do they gain so much baggage along the journey of time? But the fact is none of those things really matters. What does matter is we live in the best country in the world, at the best time in history, among the best people in the world! So take the tales with a grain of sale, and celebrate your freedom!

Our affirmations should flow easily this Independence Day as we join our fellow citizens across this nation in celebration of the freedoms we cherish and in thanksgiving for the blessings bestowed on us.

Hundreds of thousands of Americans have shed their blood to preserve our liberty since Thomas Jefferson and his colleagues penned the Declaration of Independence. Today all of us should take a moment to remember the sacrifice these thousands of young men and women made over the years
