Dear Friends,

I enjoy discovering the origins of words and phrases because how we understand and use both words and phrases across generations change, often dramatically. For example, to refer to a person as "naughty" used to mean that they had nothing or had naught. It then evolved to mean evil or immoral and, finally, in today's common English it simply means a person is behaving badly.

"The proof is in the pudding," is a centuries old phrase that used to be "The proof of the pudding is in the eating." However, some linguistics folk believe that the word, "pudding," referred to a kind of sausage which consisted of various kinds of minced meat and other ingredients packed into a casing. One would do well to eat it cautiously since that kind of food could be risky. So, the proof of the pudding is in the eating.

In our day, the "proof is in the pudding" simply means we cannot judge something unless we've tried, used or experienced it. Sometimes I don't think we even realize when we're misjudging or assuming something to be good or bad, helpful or not. I believe that's the case when it comes to the spiritual practice of stewardship. (Some will quit reading at the very mention of the term but I encourage you to read on...)

Stewardship has gotten a bad rap for a couple reasons. First, it's judged to relate only to money when it actually has to do with all the blessings we have in our lives: relationships, possessions, spiritual gifts, time, our abilities, and yes, our money. Second, it's judged to be that time of the year when "the church" (as though some of us are somehow not included in it) asks for money. Which entails "the church" getting into our personal business by making us feel guilty. Last year I was told that a stewardship drive would turn people off and drive them away. But the opposite happened. Instead, people expressed surprise at how informative and pleasant the month's emphasis on stewardship turned out to be. Additionally, more people made a financial commitment to the ministries of the church.

Here is the challenge I have for each of us. This year, in September, when our preaching and teaching are focused on financial stewardship, look at it as an opportunity to learn about it before conjuring up our old judgements about it. When invited to consider how you will measure your life, broaden your understanding of stewardship to how you use your time, spiritual gifts, abilities, and yes, your financial resources. I challenge all of us to trust God with His instructions with regard to stewardship. Let's try opening our minds to new understanding of stewardship because there is joy to be experienced!

For me, making a financial commitment in the form of a tithe has been a blessing in ways I never imagined. Of course, I love the idea that I'm following God's instructions but beyond that it makes me feel more invested in the church as a whole. It brings me joy to be involved in the way the ministries of the church change lives of so many people. It is not, for me, an obligation or a source of guilt or a burden in any way. Honestly, to financially commit to the church is an honor. The proof was in the pudding, so to speak.

Missions Corner

Updates:

Thank you to everyone who participated in our back to school supply drive at the church. We were able to bring all of the schools supplies over to "For The City", the organization that was heading up and running the drive. The supplies we donated, along with donations from others throughout Brenham, were able to help over 400 students receive school supplies to start the year off right. The remainder of the supplies was then split up between the schools to help students. Overall, it is estimated that over 800 students will be helped by all the supplies donated.

The Missions Committee was also busy with a hand sanitizer project. Before school began, the missions committee was able to deliver 3 oz. bottles of hand sanitizer to faculty, staff and teachers at each of the Brenham schools (that is over 600 bottles of hand sanitizer!). On the bottles was a prayer for the teachers for the upcoming school year. This was a way that we could show all of our staff and teachers how much they are loved and appreciated. The schools were surprised and extremely grateful we did this and many teachers have expressed their thanks.

Pastor T.J. and other pastors from the community, were able to brighten the day of students in Brenham through the Donuts and Blessing program put together by the Washington County Ministerial Association. Pastor T.J. along with Pastor Ross Shelton of 1st Baptist Church, teamed up to hand out over 175 donut holes to students at Krause Elementary. It was a great time to say hello and bless students as they began a new school year.

On August 22, the Missions Committee put together an outreach to Blinn College for new students and their families who were registering and moving in for the new school year. We were able to set up two locations to hand out water bottles and information about the church and the Wesley foundation. It was a hot day but we had many volunteers who came out and showed the love of Jesus in a practical way to students and families. Overall, we passed out at least 300 bottles of water and made connections with students and families inviting them to church and welcoming them to Blinn. We were also able to collect the names and numbers of 14 students who are interested in receiving rides to church.





Upcoming Opportunities: Van Ministry

Since we collected the names and number of students who were interested in rides to church, this has opened up an opportunity to develop a new ministry here at the church. We are looking for wonderful people who would be willing to drive either the church bus or van to pick up and drop off students each week for church. Each week we'll send a text to the students who are interested in getting a ride to and from church with the location of where to meet (for example in front of the student center). We would need someone to pick the students up by 8:15am so they can be at church for a good Sunday Morning breakfast and then bring them back to campus after service is over around 10a.m. It is less than a 10 minute drive from the church to Blinn. We are hoping to get a rotation of drivers that can either do both before and after service or maybe someone would be willing to do one way and someone else do the other way. 




