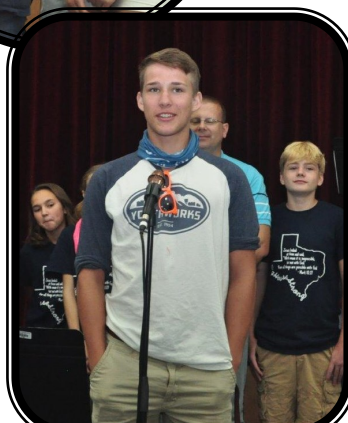


The youth and adults shared about their experiences serving in Nashville, Tn. and in Alvin, Tx.

Dear Friends,

In May, before Annual Conference, our Lay Leader, Tom Scanio and I offered a congregational vitality assembly in an effort to distribute information and answer questions about the proposals that would be considered at Annual Conference. At the assembly, I explained the three models of organization of The United Methodist Church at the called General Conference in February 2019. To catch up on “The Commission on The Way Forward” and the called General Conference next February, go to [www.umc.org/who-we-are/commission-on-a-way-forward-about-us](http://www.umc.org/who-we-are/commission-on-a-way-forward-about-us).

The task of The Commission on The Way Forward was to do a complete examination and possible revision of every paragraph of the Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and explore options that help to maintain and strengthen the unity of the church. In May they delivered their recommendation to the Council of Bishops to adopt the “One Church Model.” The Council of Bishops, in turn, voted to consider all three models next February. The only agenda item at the called General Conference in 2019 will be to consider each of the plans and then accept, adopt or amend any one of them.

The three models for the church are as follows:

**One Church Model** - The One Church Plan allows for contextualization of language about human sexuality in support of the mission; and allows for central conferences, especially those in Africa, to retain their disciplinary authority to adapt the Book of Discipline and continue to include traditional language and values while fulfilling the vision of a global and multicultural church.

This plan also encourages a generous unity by giving United Methodists the ability to address different missional contexts in ways that reflect their theological convictions. The One Church Plan removes the restrictive language of the Book of Discipline and adds assurances to pastors and Conferences who due to their theological convictions cannot perform same-sex weddings or ordain self-avowed practicing homosexuals.

**The Traditionalist Plan** would affirm the current language in the denomination’s Book of Discipline, the denomination’s governing document, and seek to strengthen enforcement.

**The Connectional-Conference Plan** would allow conferences to choose among three connectional conferences for affiliation. The connectional conferences would align based on theology or perspective on LGBTQ ministry — be it traditionalist, progressive or allowing for a variety of approaches. This plan would require multiple amendments to the denomination’s constitution.

Bishop Scott Jones will be hosting table talks in each district of our annual conference to make presentations about the models and answer questions. Our district table talk with the bishop is Thursday evening, August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 7:00 PM, at Bryan First United Methodist Church. This meeting is specifically for laity and I encourage you to attend. You must register in advance.

It was also a joy to hear from the Couch family how God is at work overseas. Through our Dollar for Missions offering we were also able to present the Couch family with a check for \$500.

Also, thank you to everyone who gave school supplies as we partnered with For the City to help meet the needs of students in our community. We filled up two large moving boxes with school supplies and still had more that wouldn't fit in the box! The Mission and Outreach team also presented a check to For the City for \$500 so they could buy extra school supplies so that as many children as possible can start out the school year blessed. What an amazing way we could show the love of Jesus in a real and practical way.



First United Methodist Church in Brenham will become one in a network of 12,000 churches worldwide equipped to offer a grief support group. This group is nondenominational, open to the public, and features biblical concepts for healing from grief.

The support group will meet weekly, beginning September 30, for the first 13-week cycle. Individuals may join at any time during that cycle. The group time includes a video featuring leading grief recovery experts, small group discussion and a journal with personal study exercises that reinforce the weekly session topics. Participants describe it as a "warm, caring environment that becomes an oasis on the long journey of grief."

Pastor Bobbie will lead the Sunday afternoon groups and is asking for people to prayerfully consider serving on the Grief Share team. Team members will be trained to understand the purpose of Grief Share, to communicate how Grief Share works, and facilitating and supporting group members. Training will begin in mid-August.

**Life Line Screening**, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings will be in our community on Monday, September 10, 2018 at First United Methodist Church of Brenham.
